Principal's Message

Welcome to our last newsletter for Term 2.

It has been a very busy and disjointed term with learning from home followed by a return to full face to face learning.

The COVID 19 restrictions are still impacting on school life without the usual sport, excursions, work placements, work experience, guest speakers, etc. These restrictions mean a lack of the variety of learning strategies that are the normal at Casino High School.

From the start of Term 3 schools are able to recommence the majority of school based activities including competitions aligned with health advice; guest speakers, special religious education, meetings and VET work placement etc. However, some other activities are still on hold. These include excursions, parent and carer attendance at assemblies and events with large numbers of adults etc. This is a start to moving towards 'normality'.

Term 3 will also see the commencement of restrictions on student use of mobile phones whilst at school.

All parents and carers should be familiar with the new school policy regarding mobile phone usage by students at school which has been endorsed by both the Casino High School P&C and AECG.

The policy has been communicated to all parents and carers through a letter sent home with students, via email and also on our Facebook page.

Restrictions on mobile phone usage is required due to the significant loss of teaching time in the classroom and the disruption in concentration by students.

Stay safe and well over the holiday period and we look forward to a successful Term 3 with all students returning to school on Tuesday 21 July.



Year 10 'LOVE Bites' Program

Year 10 students will be participating in the NAPCAN 'LOVE BiTES' program 28 and 30 July. This program looks at Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault, exploring how we as an individual, a school and a community are able to stand up and say NO! Students are invited to actively participate in the program across the two days through group activities, art works and in hip hop sessions. NSW PREMIER'S SPORTING CHALLENGE



This year our school has registered again to participate in the NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge.

Casino High School students and staff have the opportunity to get involved in the 10 week Sporting Challenge which will be starting Week 1 of Term 3. There are over 1,500 schools across NSW who are participating in the Sporting Challenge this year.

All Year 7 students will be participating in this 10 Week Challenge as part of their core PDHPE lessons and all other students have the option to complete the Challenge.

Staff members can also participate in the Staff Challenge, so that staff and students can motivate each other to be more active. The Staff Challenge encourages staff to be accountable for their health and wellbeing as well as give them the opportunity to be role models for their students.

What is the 10 Week Challenge?

The NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge encourages students and staff over a 10 week period to participate in a broad range of sports and recreational pursuits to develop their understanding of the importance of sport and physical activity. It aims to have more participants, more active, more often.

What do I have to do?

It is really easy! During the 10 week Challenge students and staff record the number of minutes/hours of physical activity they do every week by completing a logbook which is provided to them. Activities may include time spent in a broad range of sports during lunchtime, in school sport programs, class time, before or after school, on weekends, riding a bike or even going for a walk with the dog.

Why should I do it?

A goal that many people have is to become more active, but making that thought come to fruition can be difficult. The 10 Week Challenge is designed to get people setting goals to become more active, and track their results and celebrate their accomplishments.

Do I get anything for doing it?

All students and staff who submit their completed log books after completing the 10 week Challenge will receive a personalised certificate (Diamond, Gold, Silver or Bronze), signed by the Premier of New South Wales.

The Ballad of Songbirds and Snakes - Part of the Hunger Games Series



Diary of a Young Naturalist


